Case Study: Feline Chlamydia

Patient: Dudley

Species: Feline

Age: 10 months

<u>Signs</u>: Left eye: squinting, yellow discharge, red, painful and swollen

conjunctiva (the lining of the eye)

After a veterinary examination, Dudley was found to have an elevated temperature (fever), he was also sneezing and had a clear discharge from his nostrils. Due to his stuffy nose, he couldn't smell his food very well so he didn't feel like eating.

All of Dudley's signs were indicating that he was suffering from Chlamydia. This can be confirmed with an eye swab that is sent to the laboratory for testing.

Dudley probably contracted the infection from his mum during birth but adult cats can also become infected if they come in to contact with a cat that is shedding the bacteria from their respiratory tract.

Antibiotic treatment in the form of an oral paste helped Dudley feel better in no time at all. Dudley was also kept away from other cats to prevent spread of the infection.

Chlamydia can cause recurring infections so the most important measure for preventing disease is regular vaccination. Vaccination is especially important in groups of cats or for cats visiting catteries. Ask us for more information about Chlamydia.

Get to know the members of the Rex Cat Fanciers of South Australia. This edition we talk to Dianne Dolman, Burmese breeder.

Q - What is your favourite breed of cat?

Burmese of course but as a Judge of Group 2 and Group 3 I appreciate all breeds of cats, some we do not have in Australia. Like Chartreux and the Kurilean Bobtail. The Kurilean Bobtail is a native of parts of Russia.

Q - Do you have a favourite animal (other than cats of course)?

I love most animals, although I have a huge dislike of snakes & spiders.

I have bred many different birds and now our Cockatiel Dougie is a great source of amusement. He is talking now and I wonder why I am trying to teach him at the moment "Are you thirsty. Dougie wants a beer".

Q - How long have you been a breeder?

I have been in the cat world for over 47 years. I always have had a cat and my first pedigreed cat was a Chocolate Point Siamese Sabre GdPN Lenora Lia Aracaim in 1964, who I showed and so the bug had bitten I bred Seal Point Siamese. Then my Mother and I bred and perfected the Tonkinese. In 1974 I got my first Burmese a Blue Torti. She was the first Burmese entitled to be an Australian Champion but she was a TORTI not a solid colour and because she was then just under the age of 2 Years the rules got changed. All the same at the ripe age of 8 she was Best Burmese at the A. C. F. National show held in the former International Pavilion at Wayville. PHYA Anastasia went to the title of Silver Db Gd Ch and was 14 years of age when we lost her and I still miss my Sissy.

Q - What has been your favourite holiday?

Heron Island, Darwin and Broom. 3 Months overseas touring around India, Hong Kong and Judging in U.K. Denmark - and Stewarding in Amsterdam and Vienna. I guess it would be easier to say where I did not go whilst in Europe and the U.K.


Q - What is your ideal day?
